Awards of Excellence

President's Award for Multimedia Representations of Architecture

1. Purpose

This award recognizes a narrative about buildings and cities that promotes the public's understanding of architecture and the role of architects. The entry must be a body of work.

2. Eligibility

Blogs, podcasts, films, video series, curated events/exhibitions, newspapers, magazines, a book, a radio or television segment. Submissions are to have been published or broadcast in 2019-2020.

3. Submission Materials

Submissions will be completed using the NEW online submission platform.

The following items must be completed or provided:

- Completed submission form;
- Submission fee;
- A one page written statement, which explains why the submission deserves this award;
- A 100-word media statement crafted for website postings and media campaign requirements.;
- Each submission is to be accompanied by a sample of the work;
- A signed declaration form.

Submissions shall be accompanied by an entry fee of \$75.00

4. Selection Process

The Awards Committee shall appoint a jury of three each year which will be composed of the previous year's recipient and two past presidents. The jury shall be Chaired by a member of the Awards Committee.

Jury Information

- The RAIC staff will prepare an information package for the Jury members.
- The information will be sent in advance of the meeting.
- The meeting will be held via conference call.

Jury Deliberations

The jury shall forward its decision to the RAIC Board of Directors. The President shall bestow the award.

5. Number of Awards

6. Frequency

The award is to be offered every two years.

7. Public Presentation

The presentation will be at the RAIC Conference on Architecture or other suitable ceremony.
