OTTAWA October 2, 2007 – The Royal Architectural Institute of Canada Foundation is offering a new scholarship this year for \$5,000 to student with the best Master's thesis proposal.

Established through an endowment from the Canada Green Building Council (CaGBC) the main purpose of the fund is to nurture the next generation of "green" designers.

All full-time students registered in a Master's degree program leading to a professional degree in architecture at one of the accredited University Schools of Architecture in Canada or the RAIC Syllabus are eligible to apply – only one submission, however, will be accepted from each school.
